SMALL/COURTYARD GARDEN

Does your garden make an effective use of the space?

Are there a good variety of plants?

Have you made good use of height?

Do you have plants in pots and hanging baskets?

Are you able to use recycled materials

and to collect rainwater?

OVERALL GARDEN

What are the first impressions of your garden?

TIPS FOR APPLICANTS

You don't need to have spent a fortune on your garden - the judges will be looking primarily for gardens that are well cared for, loved and used.

Neither do you need to have rare plants or exotics - in fact if you've raised your own plants from cuttings or seed that will count in your favour.

Untidy corners left for wildlife is also a plus! And don't stress if flowers have gone over or are yet to bloom – gardens are continually changing and there are always plants past their best – but more to come into their own!

The judges will be looking for well cared for plants, a good use of the space, a good variety of planting, anything you do that helps sustainability, a garden that can be enjoyed year-round and by your family and wildlife!

HOW IT WORKS

The judges will look through all of the applications and photos and make a shortlist of gardens to visit in each category.

They will contact you to arrange a date and time to visit your garden.

They will make notes and decide the winner of each category after all of the gardens have been visited. The winners will be contacted directly and invited to a ceremony at the new Community Centre to receive their prizes - and the silver Seamon's Cup for the best Overall Garden.
